Introduced on 8/16 and currently under review by the Interim subcommittee work session; [New Hampshire HB656](#) permits adults to possess up to 3/4 of an ounce of marijuana, 5 grams of hash, and certain marijuana-infused products - among other cannabis-related possessions/permissions.

A **Michigan** bill, [SB969](#), has been drafted and referred to second reading. This bill states, a person shall not use or offer for use, possess, sell, or offer for sale marijuana-infused beef, wine, mixed wine, mixed spirit drink, or spirits.

September 10

A [resolution](#) was released to **Pennsylvania** lawmakers, directing the Joint State Government Commission to conduct a study of the Commonwealth's statutes and policies regarding marijuana in light of legalizing medical marijuana.

[Assembly Resolution 183](#) was released in **New Jersey**, urging Congress to pass "secure and Fair Enforcement Banking Act of 2017."

[HB377](#) in **New Hampshire** grants the liquor commission exclusive authority to sell marijuana for recreational use if it is not otherwise prohibited by the laws of the state.

An assembly bill has been introduced by **California** legislators. [AB2255](#) refers to cannabis transportation and deliveries through the state.

An act to amend section 4883 of, and to add Section 4884 to, the Business and Professions Code, relating to veterinarians in **California**. [AB2215](#) would authorize the board to revoke or suspend a veterinarian license, or to assess a fine, for accepting soliciting or offering any form of remunerating from or to a

Medicinal and Adult-Use Cannabis licensee if the vet. or his/her or her immediate family has a financial interest.

[AB2020](#) in **California** would authorize a state temporary event license to be issued to a licensee for an event to be held at any other venue expressly approved by a local jurisdiction for events.

Maine's [LD231](#) has been introduced, allow municipalities to regulate the growing of marijuana.

September 18

A bill introduced on January 12, has reached the legislative office - **New Hampshire** [HB377](#) grants the liquor commission exclusive authority to sell marijuana for recreational use if it is not otherwise prohibited by the laws of the state.
